Spring Words

with Simple Definitions

Awakening – The act of waking up or becoming more active.

Blossoming – When flowers start to open up and bloom.

Downpour – A lot of rain falling very quickly.

Equinox – The time in spring when day and night are the same length.

Fertile – Rich and full of nutrients, making it good for plants to grow.

Fiddlehead – A curled-up baby fern before it opens.

Germination – The process of a seed starting to grow into a plant.

Migration — When birds or animals move from one place to another for a season.

Morel Mushrooms – A special type of mushroom that grows in the wild during spring.

Pollination – When pollen moves from one flower to another to help make seeds.

Regrowth – When plants or trees grow back after being cut or lost.

Rejuvenation – When something becomes fresh and full of life again.

Sapling – A young, small tree.
